DUTIES: Under the general supervision of the Deputy Director, the technical and first level supervision of the Area Manager, Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Relief (PED), and the administrative support of the PAHO/WHO Representative of the country of assignment, and in close consultation with the PWRs of countries assigned to the position for emergency preparedness oversight, the incumbent is responsible for, but not necessarily limited to, the following assigned duties in the countries under his/her responsibility:

- In accordance to PED's regional strategic plan, promote and assist in the development of subregional and national policies and programs to prevent, mitigate, prepare for, or respond to national emergencies caused by disasters, be they natural, technological, biological, chemical, radiological, or resulting from social conflicts;
- Advise Member States and other organizations at regional and national levels on measures to reduce the vulnerability of the health sector infrastructure including water sanitation networks, etc.;
- Provide technical support in the establishment and/or strengthening of national disaster prevention and preparedness program in the health sector, including management;
- Assist countries in improving the national level of knowledge in disaster management (from prevention to response) by supporting the organization of intercountry and multidisciplinary courses or meetings and promote the inclusion of the topic into academic curricula;
- Prepare and disseminate technical material and other information to promote public awareness and positive action on disaster issues in collaboration with the Regional Disaster Documentation Center (CRID) and others as may be appropriate;
- Promote the adoption of appropriate national disaster legislation;
- Promote the inclusion of relevant disaster management activities in the core responsibilities of other PAHO/WHO specialized regional areas and disaster focal points of PWR Offices, as well as other international institutions;
- Promote standards and best practices, including transparency and accountability, in the management of humanitarian relief operations and especially logistic supply systems (SUMA/LSS);
- Provide technical leadership and support for the rapid assessment of health related needs and the coordination of an appropriate international health response in the case of disasters; assist the UN system agencies in providing the health expertise and information required, in particular to the UN Disaster Assessment Coordination Team (UNDAC), ECLAC, and other evaluation teams.
- Assist in mobilization of resources through liaison with donors and formulation of projects;
- Supervise staff assigned, the implementation of projects including financial execution, develop work programs and manage the subregional office;
- Promote partnership with regional and subregional agencies such as CAN, CAPRADE, ISDR, MERCOSUR, donors and other international organizations based in South America toward the strengthening of the health sector;
- Perform other related duties, as assigned.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Education: A master's degree from a recognized university with a minimum of 2 years of academic or professional training in any health, social or earth science, architecture, engineering or disciplines related to disaster.

Experience: Nine years of combined national and international experience in a managerial position in public health, social services, planning or public administration. Of these, at least three years of experience directly related to reducing the impact of disasters on the health and welfare of population.

Languages: Very good knowledge of Spanish with working knowledge of English. Other UN languages would be an asset.
