

DUST CONTROL ISSUES IN THE PASO DEL NORTE REGION

WERC and the NM Green Zia Environmental Excellence Program are pleased to announce a one-day workshop on dust control issues in the Paso del Norte region. The workshop is being presented as part of the Paso del Norte Pollution Prevention Roundtable with ongoing support from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 6.

Dust pollution in Paso del Norte is a major source of environmental health concerns, specifically respiratory disease among youth and the elderly. Dust storms adversely affect agricultural production and have recently caused numerous highway accidents in the region.

The workshop will include presentations on measures of controlling dust in southern New Mexico, Ciudad Juárez and West Texas with a focus on the technologies available to reduce particulate material in the Paso del Norte region. Air quality regulations will be discussed as well as a case study from Maricopa County in neighboring Arizona.

Vendors will be available to present and discuss the latest technologies designed to improve air quality in the region.

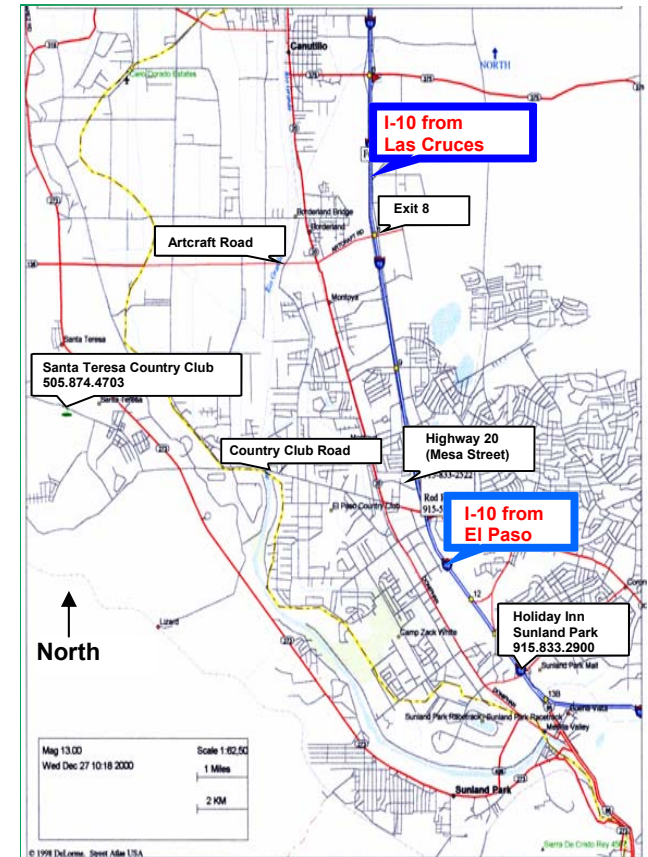
